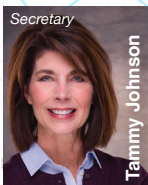

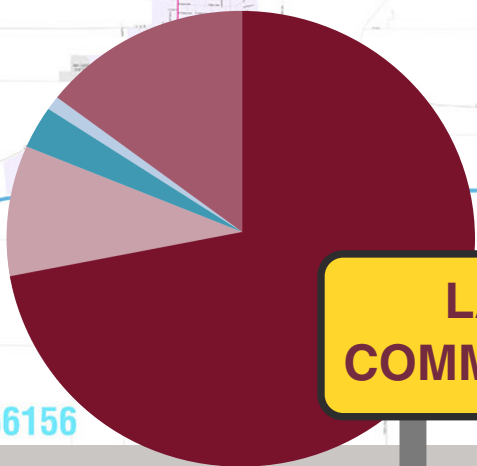

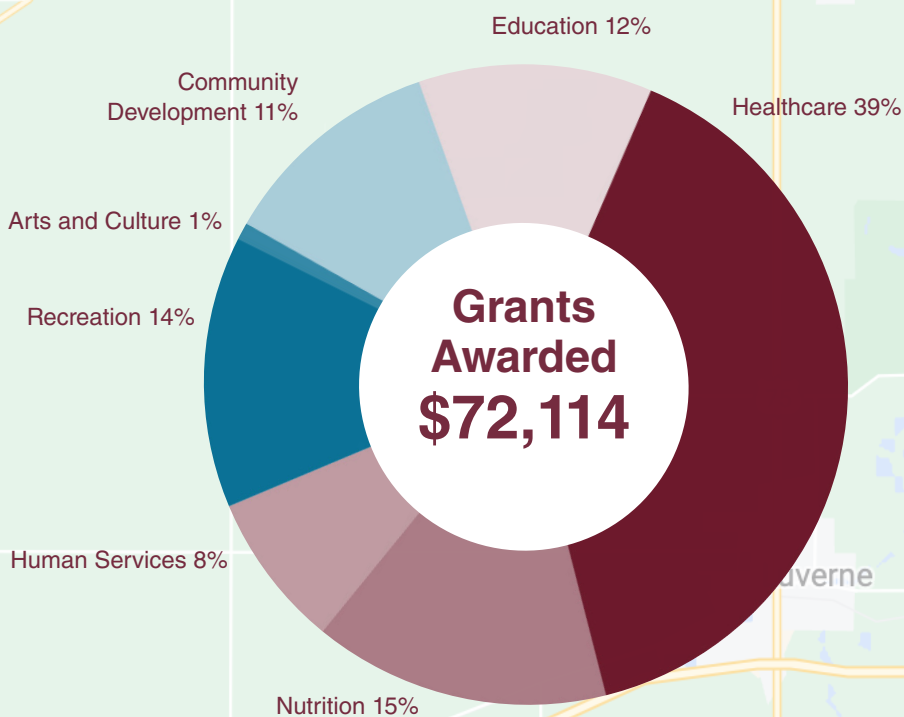

Every year for as many years as she can remember Elaine Hansen has applied for the America's Farmers Grow Communities through the Bayer Fund. The purpose of the Grow Communities program is to partner with farmers to make a positive impact in farm communities across the country by supporting local non profit organizations. Since the program began in 2010 more than \$63 million has been directed to organizations across rural America. Elaine was shocked when she was notified that her application was a Bayer Fund choice for 2022. Elaine chose the Luverne Area Community Foundation as the eligible charity to accept the grant. The Grant must be used by the eligible charity to improve science, health and nutrition in communities and organizations within the county where the winning farmer farms or resides. Elaine and her husband Ray have a passion for their faith and making sure no one in their community would be in a state of food shortage. A good steward of these two passions Elaine opened an endowment fund called Feeding the 5000 – a fund to be used to offer gifts to the local food shelf and backpack program and potentially any other food/hunger based program. The fund is open for others to contribute to as well and will have long lasting fruitful gifts to those in need.

CHILD'S REMEMBRANCE GARDEN

The mission of the newly developed Child's Remembrance Garden is to provide a non-denominational safe area for people who have lost a child to grieve, remember and heal. The garden is in the Northwest corner of Dragonfly Park off James St. and Northwest of St. Catherine's Cemetery.

The vision to create such a space came from Maggie Siebenhaler who lost a baby girl Kimber, born stillborn. Maggie was devastated. She sought counseling for her grief. Her counselor directed her to the Mother's Garden in Dell Rapids, SD. In the Mother's Garden, Maggie found peace and comfort and it made her wonder why there wasn't a garden closer to her hometown in Luverne, MN.

As Kimber's first birthday approached, a friend asked Maggie how she planned to commemorate the day. Maggie said, "I want to make a garden."

Saum, who facilitate the local Compassionate Friends Grief Group a committee was formed, a location was identified, and work began toward creating the Child's Remembrance Garden.

Why a garden?

Maggie said she visits Kimber's grave often, "But the cemetery is very sad for me. The garden is calming and inspiring." Maggie said the Child's Remembrance Garden will help grieving parents know they are not alone and it's a peaceful place where their children will be remembered.

CREATING A BRIGHTER TOMORROW

How one chooses to respond when the unthinkable happens in life is unknown until it affects you.

Carson Ehde took his life at age 21 on Sept. 13, 2022, after a few months of depression-like symptoms and an inability to see a path toward wellness. He had expressed shame in his lack of motivation and frustration with poor access to effective treatment.

Following his death, Carson's family and friends channeled gifts and resources into a local fund that they hoped could prevent the same outcome in others.

"We dream of a day when caring for our brains is no different from treating allergies, injuries or any other physical ailment," they shared.

"Kids in second grade learn about



the importance of brushing their teeth. We hope a new generation of kids will grow up recognizing common brain ailments, knowing how to talk about them and having access to straightforward treatment — without shame, stigma or obstacles of an inadequate health care system. Had Carson and other suicide victims of his era been equipped in this way, we wonder if their outcomes could have been different.”

The mission of Carson's Cause is to partner with schools and community groups to:

- recognize early symptoms of struggling brain health.
- normalize discussion about it.
- simplify access to care.
- provide options for emergency help, including the 988 Suicide Lifeline.

While the fund exists to support all such efforts, those involving youth will be prioritized, because kids are tomorrow's leaders, and they'll be best equipped to make a difference having grown up with proper dialogue and tools.

Carson's Cause hopes to build a future where the following is true:

- All classrooms have a curriculum and plan that supports the brain health of all students.
- All teens and young adults have the tools to navigate brain health issues and to seek help when needed.
- Everyone recognizes brain health as an important component of general health and wellness.

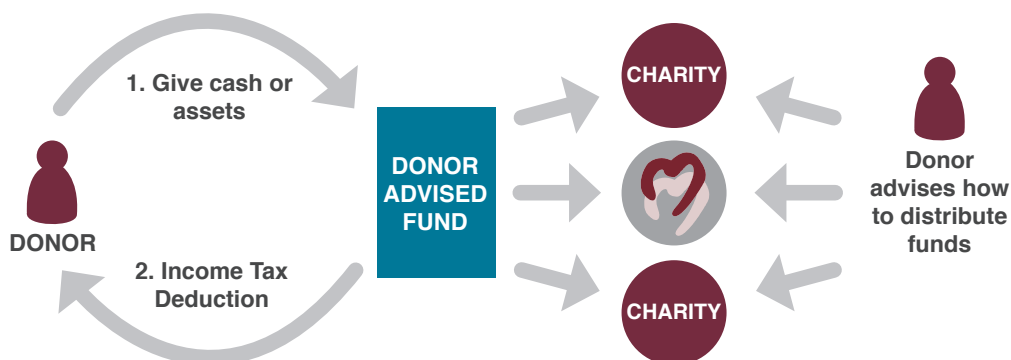

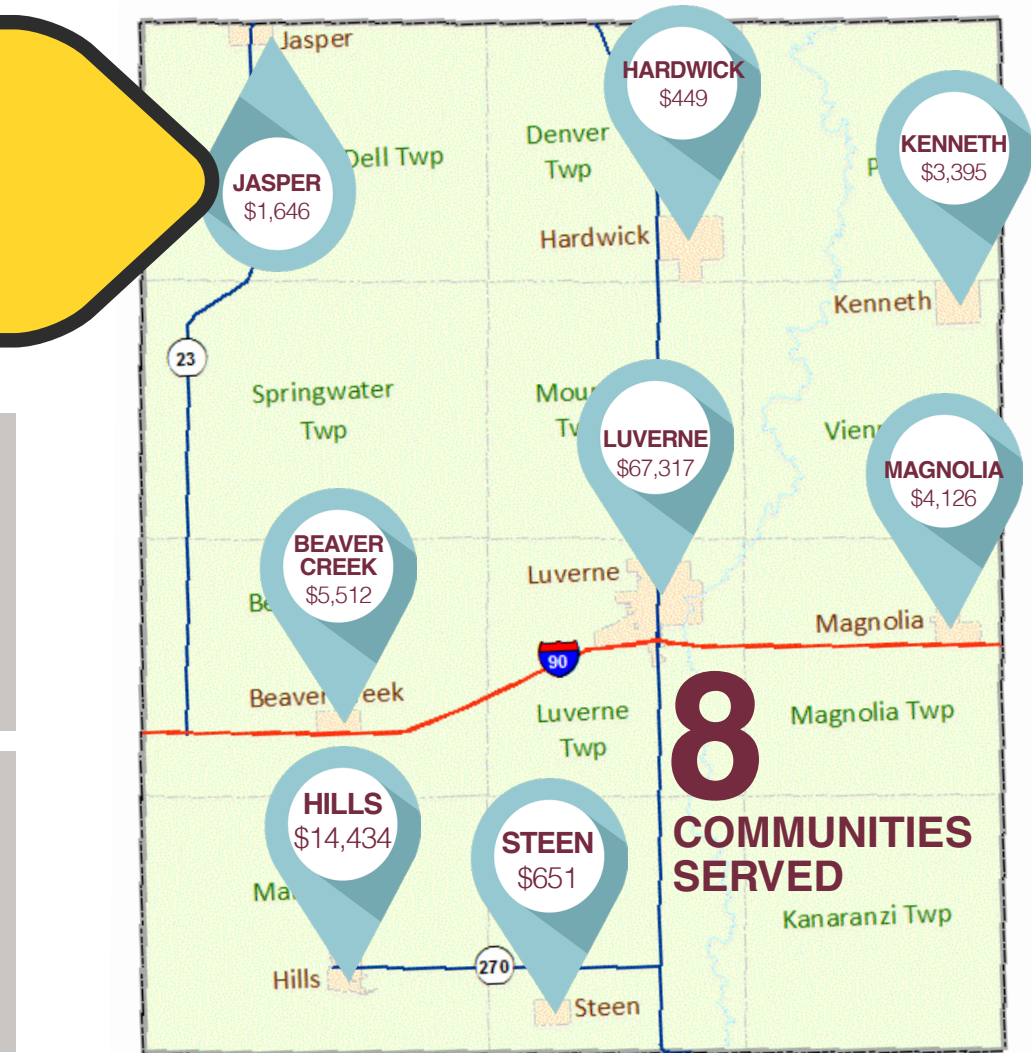

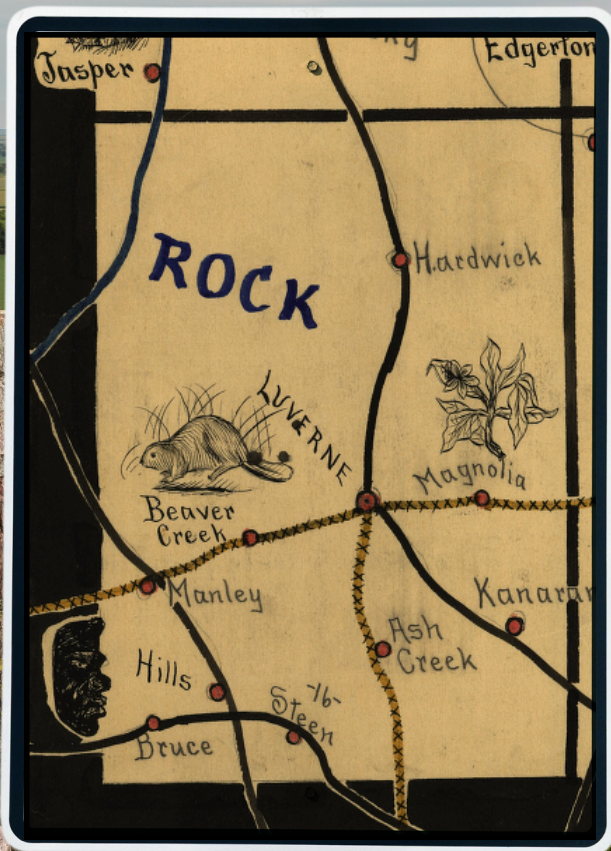
